Inwood Forest Stormwater Detention Project

- A partnership project between the Harris County Flood Control District and City of Houston
- The Flood Control District is developing a plan to:
 - Design and build stormwater detention basins
 - Provide flood damage reduction benefits during heavy storms
 - Mitigate impacts of future public projects as appropriate

Property & Project Areas

- 226-acre property, east and west of Antoine Drive, within the Inwood Forest subdivision that was previously a golf course
- Located in the White Oak Bayou and Vogel Creek watersheds
- Property may only be used as parkland, for recreational purposes and for stormwater detention purposes

Project Goal

- The goal for stormwater storage capacity for all of the basins combined is approximately 1,200 acre-feet, for shared use by Harris County Flood Control District and the City of Houston
- The basins will vary in stormwater storage capacity, which is measured in acre-feet
 - One acre-foot is equal to the volume (as in stormwater) that would cover one acre to a depth of one foot, or 43,560 cubic feet (325,850 gallons)

Project Status – Phase I

Soon after adoption of an Interlocal Agreement, the Flood Control District will study the site, which involves:

- Surveying
 - Identify property lines adjacent to the project area
 - Mark trees to identify species and assess condition

Project Status – Phase I

- Preliminary Engineering
 - Prepare a model to determine the potential capacity of each proposed stormwater detention basin
 - The goal is to maximize stormwater storage volume, and to complement the basins with trees and areas on site for recreation

Collaboration & Communication

- A partnership between the Harris County Flood Control District and the City of Houston
- The City of Houston will contact neighborhood stakeholders to discuss the design of recreational improvements adjacent to the detention basins
- The Flood Control District will keep the property owners and stakeholders informed of the upcoming activities related to the project

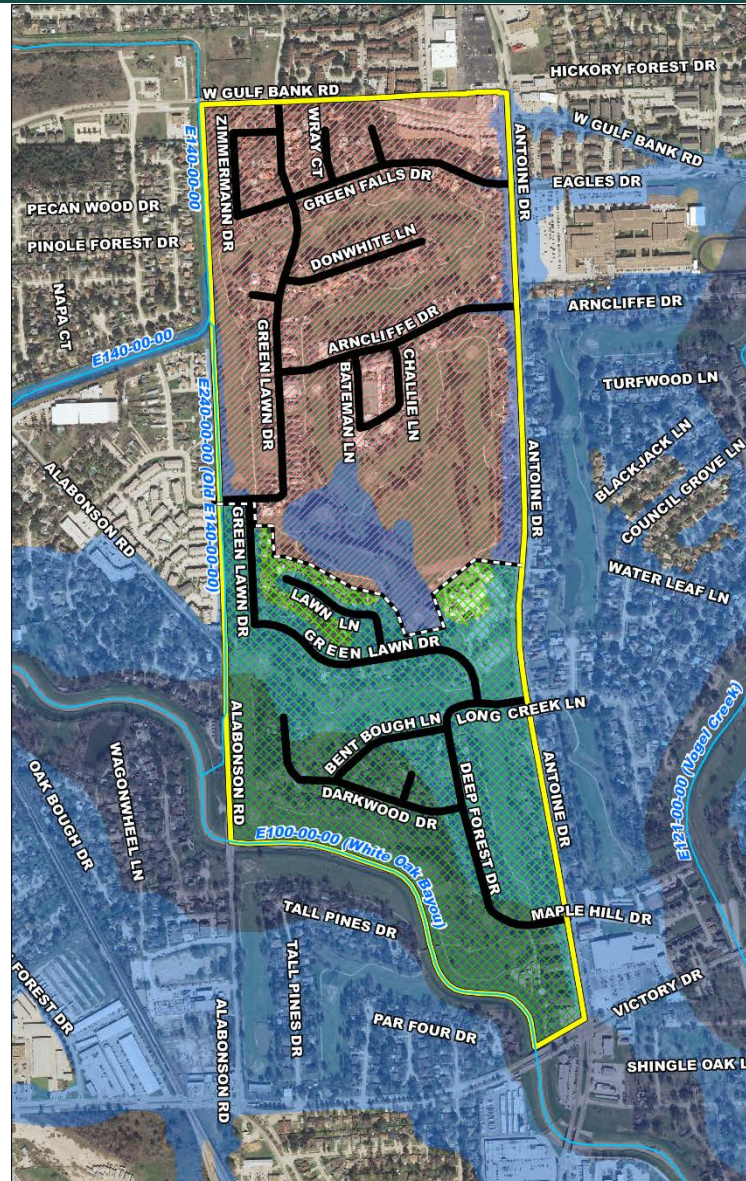

Proposed Cross Section

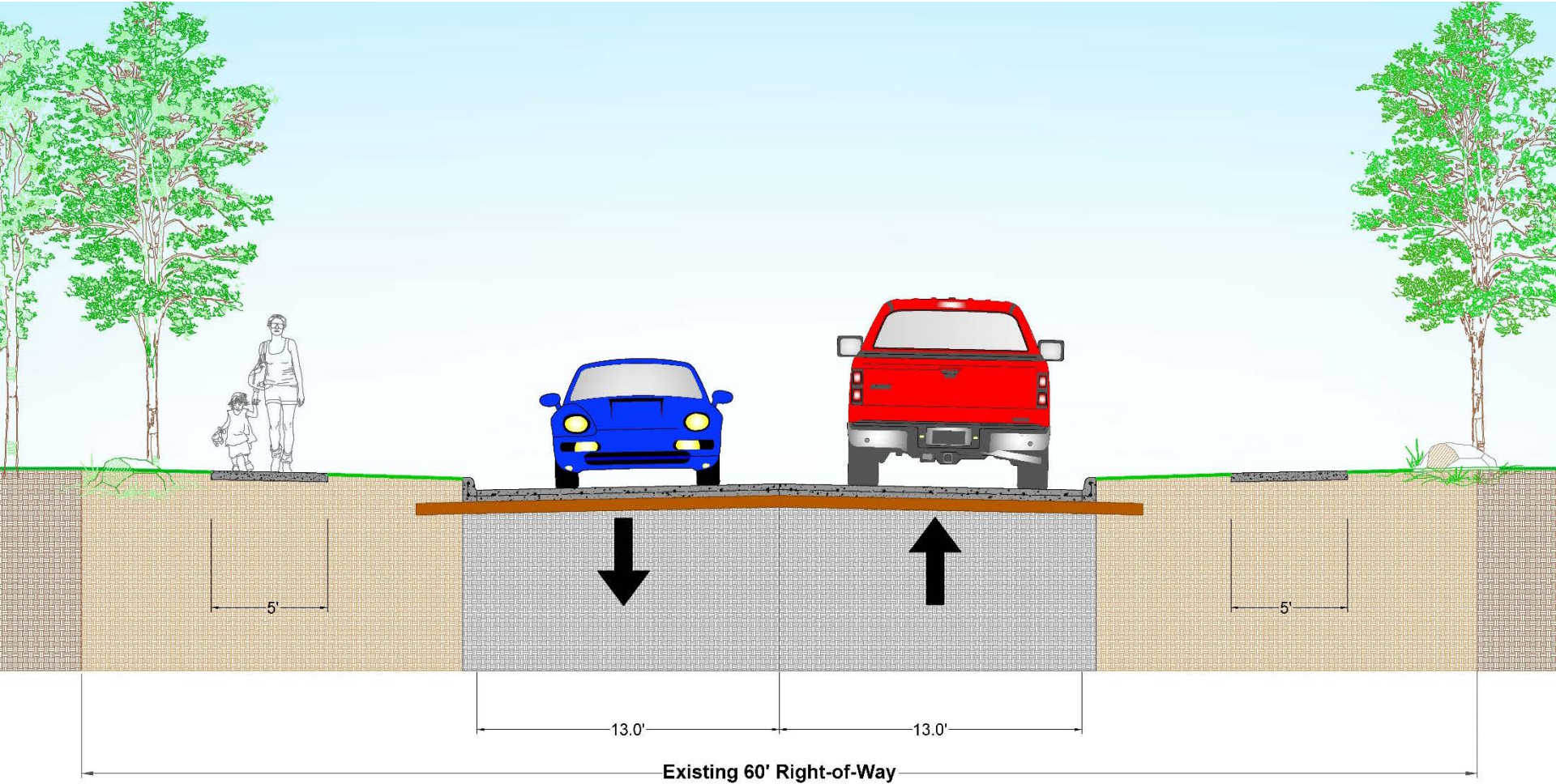

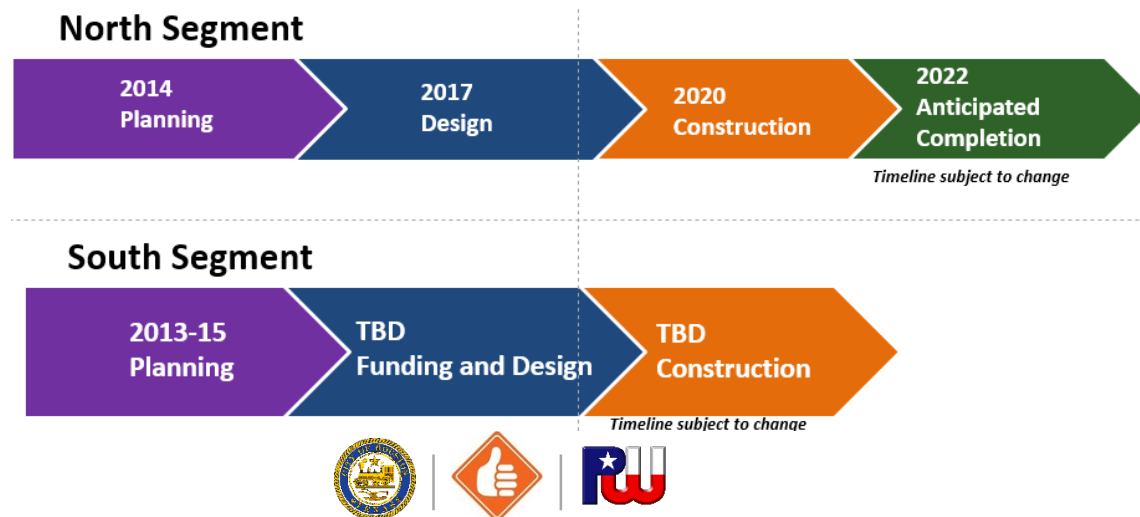

 - Once Antoine South enters the CIP, we will schedule a separate meeting to update residents on the project.

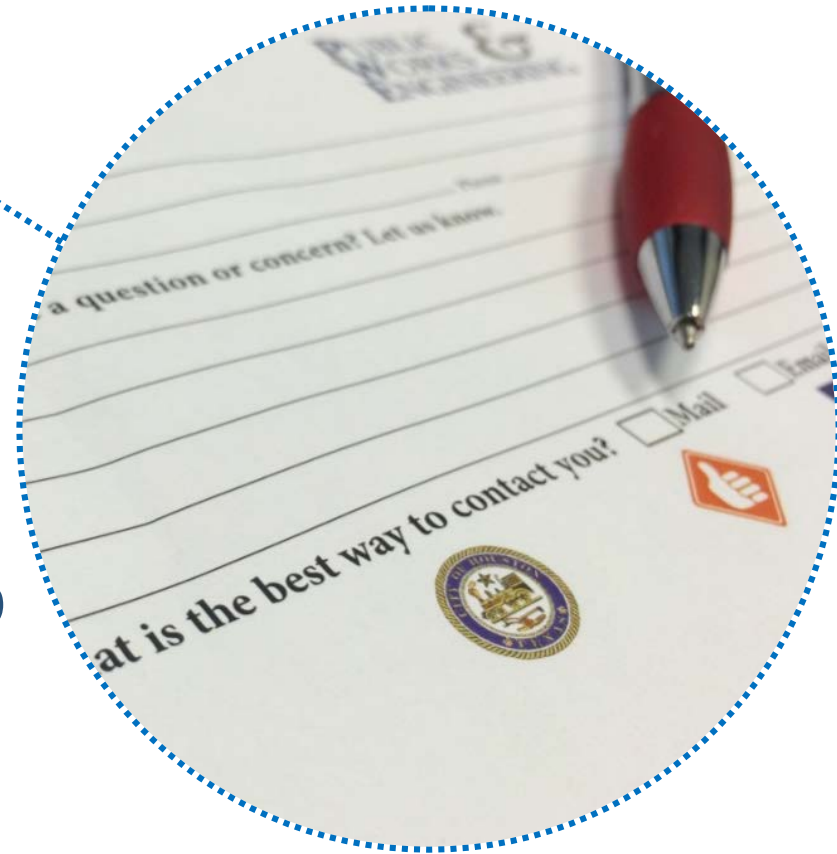
