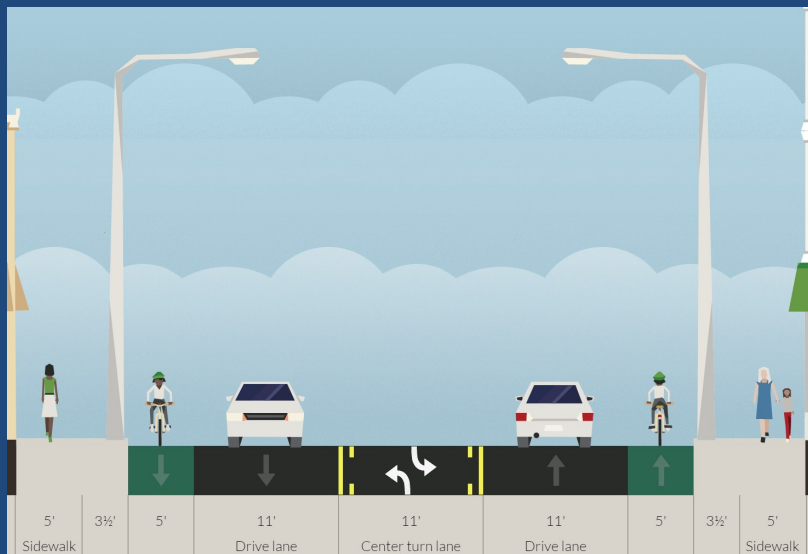
## Weslayan to Buffalo Speedway



### ADDRESSING PUBLIC WORKS & ENGINEERING DEPARTMENT OWNED INFRASTRUCTURE

Located in City Council District C, West Alabama Street Project (CIP number N-000751) is scheduled to be reconstructed from Weslayan to Buffalo Speedway, approximately 0.7 miles in length. The project will design and reconstruct a 3-Lane concrete roadway and other Public Works and Engineering Department owned infrastructure. An off-street shared use path or on street bicycle lanes will be added and sidewalks will be rebuilt to ADA compliance. Additionally, underground water, sewer and storm sewer pipes will be replaced as necessary.

#### Option 1. On Street Bike Lanes



Two 11ft lanes and one 11ft continuous turn lane. The two 11ft travel lanes will include a striped 5ft bicycle lane on each side. Two 5ft sidewalks on both sides of street.

#### Option 2. Off Street Shared Use Path



Two-11ft lanes and one 11ft continuous turn lane. A 10ft off-street shared use path on north side of street. One 5ft sidewalk on south side of street.

# TIMMONS LANE INTERSECTION

Realignment of lanes through intersection will remove the skewed lanes of the northbound Timmons Lane through traffic. In addition, turning movements will be improved. Pedestrian safety and accessibility will also be addressed.
