OVERVIEW

- **Purpose:** To replace and upgrade the existing water distribution system in the project area.
- Construction Cost: \$3.2 million
- **Timeline:** 07/02/2018 Construction begins 08/21/2019 Anticipated project completion

Project Scope




Replace old water distribution system with new system to provide:

- ✓Increased Fire Protection

Prepare for Construction

- Construction is within City Right-of-way
- Know how to report a concern or problem
- Be aware of the potential service impacts
 - Potential water service impacts
 - Potential lane closures
 - Potential school bus re-routes

City Right-of-Way (ROW)

- City ROW generally extends 10-17 feet into your yard
- Remove items of value (special landscaping features such as fountains and lawn art) within the City ROW
- Document the conditions of your yard and sprinkler head locations.
 Contractor will do the same.
- Expect temporary lane closures during the process.

How to Report a Concern or Problem

- √ Keep your door hanger throughout the project
 - Lists phone numbers you need
 - Lists the Project Number

✓Contact 311

- Report the project name and the project number
- Request issue be directed to Houston Public Works- Capital Projects
- Be as complete as possible with your concern
- ✓ Meet the City PM or Inspector
 - Will be your contact to resolve issues throughout construction



Potential Water Service Impacts

Planned service interruption:

- Waterline replacement notification 24 to 48 hours in advance
- Periodic
- May last 2 to 4 hours

Accidental/Unplanned Interruption:

• The contractor will work quickly to restore services.

Tree Impact

- Our goal is to protect all trees during construction.
 - We accomplish this by working with the City Arborist.



Currently as part of this project, no trees are set to be removed

Potential Bus Re-Routes

School Buses

- The City of Houston and the Contractor will work with all schools to minimize impacts to students, school bus schedules, and school bus stops
- School buses may need to use different streets temporarily

Metro Buses

No metro bus stops will be affected or re-routed due to construction

Restoration

- Restoration of sprinkler systems, grass, etc. will be done during the final stage of construction.
- City does not approve final payment to contractor until restoration is complete.
- If you have concerns:
 - Document (writing, photo, etc.)
 - Call 3-1-1
 - Do not make the repairs yourself
