**Quiet Zone Status:** East End I: Navigation Blvd. to Hughes Road. The first phase of construction is scheduled to begin March 7.

**Light Rail:** Light Rail East and Southeast extension lines completed by Metro on Capitol, Rusk, Harrisburg and Scott. City of Houston in the process of assuming responsibility for maintenance and operation of traffic infrastructure along these corridors. Engineering personnel are monitoring traffic operations and implementing adjustments throughout this process.

# Public Works and Engineering ... Did you know?

What is a pothole? A pothole is a hole in the roadway pavement that may vary in size and shape formed when water seeps under the pavement and weakens the road base. As vehicles run over these weakened areas, the pavement breaks up and the hole gets larger. In the city of Houston, a pothole is considered any area of missing or severely deteriorated pavement that is up to about 5 feet by 5 feet. What is the fastest way to report a street, drainage, traffic, water or waste water service issue? Call 311 or download the mobile app on your smart phone. The 311 operators know what information to collect and will create a case number used to track the item from start to finish.





Stop sewer backups - Corral The Grease! Do not pour fats, oils and grease (FOG) down the kitchen drain. These harden in the sewer pipes, restrict flow and cause sewer backups into your home and into city streets. Other enemies to the system include coffee grounds and filters, paper towels, baby diapers, feminine hygiene products, and plastics. #### Turn Around Don't Drown®

- Houston's streets are designed to be part of the drainage system
  when the ditch and storm sewer infrastructure are inundated by
  periods of heavy, sustained rainfall. Houston is prone to flooding
  due to its flat terrain, size of the impervious developed areas,
  slowly-absorbing soil, and potential for thunderstorms, tropical
  storms and hurricanes.
- Did you know that in certain flooding conditions, a vehicle can be washed away in less than 12 inches of fast-moving floodwater?
   Most flood-related deaths are due to motorists attempting to cross a flooded low-water crossing or road. Know your flood risk. Avoid travel during intense rainfall – or Turn Around, Don't Drown!
